Oyster Week	October 1, 2016 (begins Sept. 16)	Oyster Week is a series of adventurous dining events and activities that benefit sustainable aquaculture.
Chile Pepper Festival	October 1, 2016	The Chile Pepper Festival features fiery foods like hot sauces, spicy pickles, "hot" chocolates, and chili peppers, plus sizzling music like salsa and Afro-Brazilian funk, at the Brooklyn Botanic Garden.
Affordable Art Fair	October 1 - 2, 2016 (begins Sept. 29)	Browse contemporary paintings, prints, sculptures, and photographs from 50 galleries at the Affordable Art Fair , which includes workshops and activities at Metropolitan Pavilion. Repeats in March. Discount tickets \$6 to \$13.
Architecture & design films	October 1 - 2, 2016 (begins Sept. 28)	Architecture & Design Film Festival features films, panel discussions with design leaders and filmmakers, and parties at Cinépolis Chelsea.
Maker fair	October 1 - 2, 2016	See 600 exhibits about science, art, creativity, and innovation, and meet the makers at World Maker Faire New York at New York Hall of Science.
Dance festival	October 1 - 8, 2016 (begins Sept. 26)	Fall for Dance Festival features 20 international dance companies in five unique programs and two world premiere commissions at City Center.

Gypsy music	October 1 - 8, 2016 (begins Sept. 18)	New York Gypsy Festival includes six shows from Turkey, Hungary, Bulgaria, Macedonia, and the U.S.A.
Crafts fair	October 1-2 and 8-9, 2016	Autumn Crafts Festival features hundreds of juried artists, entertainment, and craft demonstrations in tents outside the Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts. Repeats in June. Free.
New York Film Festival	October 1 - 16, 2016 (begins Sept. 30)	See classics, documentaries, and full-length feature films by the world's great filmmakers at the New York Film Festival (NYFF) .
Dance party & show	October 1 - 29, 2016 (10 p.m. Saturdays)	Dance to DJ music and watch costumed performers and high-flying acrobats at Gotham [website has sound], a standing-room-only party at Webster Hall for age 19+. Discount tickets \$6.
Halloween at the zoo	October 1 - 30, 2016 (weekends)	Boo at the Zoo features costume parades, magic shows, a hay maze, scary stories, pumpkin carving, and treats at the Bronx Zoo and is included free with a regular ticket. Weekends and Oct. 10. Architecture and design month
Architecture and design month	October 1 - 31, 2016	Archtober offers special tours of buildings (some by boat), lectures, films, and exhibitions that help us to appreciate architecture and design in everyday life.
Haunted house	Oct. 1 - Nov. 5, 2016 (begins Sept. 30)	Intense, creepy actors confront you in the labyrinth of passageways at Blood Manor , 163 Varick Street. Not for pre-teens. See schedule. Discount tickets \$19.
Classic soul & motown revue	October 1 - Dec. 18, 2016	A Decade of Soul features the best R&B music of the classic soul era performed live on stage at B.B. King Blues Club. Discount tickets \$10.

Pizza party	October 5, 2016	Eat \$1 pizza samples from dozens of New York City's best pizzerias at Slice Out Hunger in St. Anthony's Church.
Parade of Boats	October 5, 2016 (6 p.m.)	Watch the Parade of Boats , including working ships, historic sailboats, magnificent yachts, and fireboats, as a narrator describes their history and purpose at Pier 62.
Odd art	October 6 - 9, 2016	You never know what to expect when Art in Odd Places brings visual and performance art to 14th Street nearly its entire length. The 2016 theme is race . Free.
Literary and arts festival	October 7 - 9, 2016	Hear famous and influential authors, journalists, poets, screenwriters, and cultural icons speak at the New Yorker Festival , which also includes comedy, film screenings, tastings, and walking tours.
Natural fiber festival	October 8, 2016	Kings County Fiber Festival features a marketplace of natural-fiber artists who crochet, dye, felt, knit, quilt, spin, and weave, plus crafting demonstrations and an art exhibit at historic Old Stone House in Brooklyn
Tugboat races	October 9, 2016	The Great North River Tugboat Race & Competition begins with a tug parade and ends in contests and awards at Pier 84. Free, or buy tickets to board the spectator boat leaving Pier 83.
Columbus Day Parade	October 10, 2016	Watch 35,000 marchers and 100 bands, floats, and contingents go up Fifth Avenue from 44th to 72nd in the Columbus Day Parade . Free. See the official street closure announcement a few days prior.

Pow wow	October 10, 2016	The Indigenous Peoples Day Native American Festival features artists, singers, colorful dancers, and authentic tribal cuisine on Randall's Island
Wine & food festival	October 13 - 16, 2016	New York City Wine & Food Festival (NYCWFF) features cooking demonstrations by celebrity chefs, seminars, classes, wine tasting, and celebrity dinners, which all support charity.
Film festival	October 13 - 16, 2016	See films (including documentaries) about global issues at Chelsea Film Festival in three venues.
Cultural film festival	October 13 - 16, 2016	The Margaret Mead Film Festival screens 50 outstanding non-fiction films and hosts special events and performances that explore world cultures at the American Museum of Natural History.
Beer bash	October 14 - 15, 2016	Discount tickets \$39.
Animal film festival	October 14 - 23, 2016	See stunning films (mostly short) about wildlife worldwide, and attend an opening party or panel discussion at Wildlife Conservation Film Festival .
Japanese flower arranging	October 15, 2016 (2 p.m.)	See a Japanese master demonstrate ikebana , hear a talk about it, watch a traditional ceremony, and attend a reception afterwards at Japan Society.
Dog films	October 15, 2016	The Dog Film Festival features films about the bond between dogs and humans at Symphony Space. Discount tickets \$11.
Marco Polo Festival	October 15, 2016	Marco Polo Festival celebrates Chinatown and Little Italy with a puppet parade (map) followed by cultural performances at Grand St. and Mott St. Free.

Jazz festival	October 15, 2016 (2 to 7 p.m.)	Hear legendary jazz artists at Staten Island Jazz Festival at Snug Harbor Cultural Center.
Architecture open house	October 15 - 16, 2016 (launch party Oct. 13)	Visit 200 of the city's architecturally and culturally significant spaces and places (many closed to the public) during Open House New York Weekend . Free.
Oyster Festival	October 15 - 16, 2016	The Oyster Festival has live entertainment, tall ships, pirate shows, midway rides, art, oyster eating and shucking contests, and a seafood court in Oyster Bay on Long Island. Free.
Bad theater	October 15 - 30, 2016 (weekends)	Bad Theater Fest welcomes new writers and actors, often with hilarious results, at The Pit Loft.
Harvest festival	October 16, 2016	Buy a pumpkin, take a nature walk, hear music, play games, do crafts, ride a pony, pet animals, shop from food & craft vendors, and visit a beer tent at Harvest Fest & Pumpkin Patch in Queens Botanical Garden
Science day in Brooklyn	October 16, 2016 (10 a.m. to 4 p.m.)	City of Science offers interactive demonstrations and hands-on activities about science, technology, math, and engineering indoors at Park Slope Armory. Free.
White Light Festival	October 16 - Nov. 16, 2016	See world-class performances, films, and artist talks with a focus on music during White Light Festival at Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts.
Apple day	October 20, 2016	Join 1 million New Yorkers eating apples today. Find locations for Big Apple Crunch on the website. Free.
Taste of the world	October 20, 2016	Try food and drink from 20 countries as you walk around Edible Escape at 172 Norfolk Street.

Hard cider festival	October 21 - 30, 2016	Cider Week celebrates traditional hard cider with tastings, flights, pairings, classes, and events
Candlelight Ghost Tours	October 21 - 22 and 27 - 30, 2016	Doors slam, floorboards creak, and voices call into the night during evening Candlelight Ghost Tours at Merchant's House Museum.
Day of the Dead	October 22, 2016	Families celebrate the departed with live music and art activities during Dia de los Muertos: Day of The Dead Celebration at Brooklyn Children's Museum.

Halloween show	October 28, 2016 (7 & 10 p.m.)	Watch a silent classic horror film with live organ, and then see an immersive show of fantastic creatures that surround you at Halloween Extravaganza at The Cathedral of St. John the Divine.
Crypt tour	October 28 - 29, 2016	Bring a flashlight for a guided tour of the crypt at The Cathedral Church of St. John the Divine, and hear stories about the entombed, during Crypt Crawl for ages 12+.
